#### What is Sahana?

- A free & open source <u>portable</u> web tool
- Modules designed to address common
   Disaster Management problems
- A Rapid Application Development (RAD) platform

#### Main Goals

- Bring efficiencies to disaster response coordination
- Facilitate effective information exchange between responders and beneficiaries
- Primary focus is to help victims





#### The Historic Trigger: 12/26/04 Indian Ocean Tsunami

- At least 226,000 dead
- Up to 5 million people lost homes, or access to food and water
- 1 million people left without a means to make a living
- At least \$7.5 billion in the cost of damages

#### Sahana Core Modules

- Organization Registry
  - Maintains data (contact, services, etc) of groups, organizations and volunteers responding to the disaster



- Missing Persons / Disaster
   Victim Registry
  - Helps track and find missing, deceased, injured and displaced people and families






#### Sahana Core Modules

- Request Management
  - Tracks all requests and helps match pledges for support, aid and supplies to fulfilment
- Location Registry
  - Tracks data on all important places to the disaster response, such as temporary shelters and medical facilities
